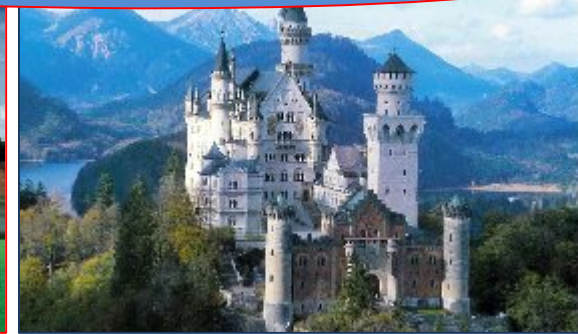

### DAY 1, FRIDAY

USA - MOSCOW

Depart today on an overnight jet flight for Moscow.

### DAY 2, SATURDAY

MOSCOW

You'll be met and transferred to your hotel. The balance of the day is free for independent activities and meeting your fellow travelers. (D)

### DAY 3, SUNDAY

MOSCOW

Moscow, one of the largest cities in the world, is the symbolic heart and soul of the country. Sightseeing begins at Red Square, dominated by St. Basil's Cathedral and the massive red walls of the Kremlin. We visit the Armory; then proceed to see Moscow University and the popular Arbat shopping district. Drive on wide boulevards and stroll through GUM, the largest Russian department store. The balance of the day is at leisure. (B)

### DAY 4, MONDAY

MOSCOW - NOVGOROD

After an early breakfast, we depart for Tver, an ancient trading port nestled against the banks of the Volga. The city offers fascinating treasures, including Putevoy Dvoretz, built for Catherine the Great as a stop-over on her journey from Moscow to St. Petersburg. We end the day in Novgorod, founded almost twelve centuries years ago. (B,D)

### DAY 5, TUESDAY

NOVGOROD - ST.PETERSBURG

Our morning sightseeing tour of Novgorod starts at the Kremlin with a visit to St. Sophia Cathedral in the citadel. Cross the river over a pedestrian bridge to visit Yaroslav Court. In the afternoon, travel to St. Petersburg. Upon arrival, enjoy a visit to Peter and Paul Fortress and to St. Isaac's Cathedral. (B,D)

### DAY 6, WEDNESDAY

ST.PETERSBURG

There are not many cities in the world that can match the grace of St. Petersburg. When Peter the Great founded the city in 1703, he hired Europe's best architects, craftsmen and artists to build and decorate it. Spread over 100 islands linked by over 600 bridges, it is often referred to as "Venice of the North". The morning sightseeing tour will feature the world-famous Hermitage which houses many art treasures from the Czarist era. The balance of the day is at leisure. (B)

### DAY 7, THURSDAY

ST.PETERSBURG - TALLINN

We continue to Tallinn, the capital of Estonia, situated on the southern coast of the Bay of Finland. This is an old town with typical narrow, medieval streets, towers, town walls, Gothic



churches, merchant and manor houses from the 13th to 17th centuries. (B,D)

#### **DAY 8, FRIDAY**

TALLINN - RIGA

Our morning sightseeing tour of Tallinn features Town Hall, the orthodox Alexander Nevsky Cathedral and Toompea Castle. We then travel to Riga, capital of Latvia. (B,D)

#### **DAY 9, SATURDAY**

RIGA

This morning's sightseeing tour features Riga Castle, housing the Pioneer Palace and the Museums of History, Art and Literature. The afternoon is free. (B)

#### **DAY 10, SUNDAY**

RIGA - VILNIUS

In the morning, we travel to Vilnius, the capital of Lithuania. (B,D)

#### **DAY 11, MONDAY**

VILNIUS

St. Peter and Paul Church with over 2,000 statues and reliefs, Upper Town with Gediminas Tower and Vilnius Castle are the highlights of our morning sightseeing tour. The afternoon is free. (B)

#### **DAY 12, TUESDAY**

VILNIUS - WARSAW

We bid farewell to Lithuania and cross into Poland. At day's end, we reach Warsaw, the capital. (B,L,D)

#### **DAY 13, WEDNESDAY**

WARSAW

Your sightseeing tour includes a drive along the famous Royal Route from magnificent Castle Square to Lazienki Park and Palace. Pass by the Palace of Science and Culture, the Saxon gardens, the tomb of the Unknown Soldier, monument to the Heroes of the Warsaw Ghetto and the Barbican. Continue with a walking tour of Old Town, Market Square and St. John's Cathedral. Use the balance of the day for shopping or attend an optional late afternoon Chopin concert. (B)

Captivating scenery unfolds before us on our journey to Krakow via Czestochowa, Poland's pilgrimage center known for the blackened picture of St. Mary popularly called the "Black Madonna". Wawel Castle, St. Mary's Church, the Renaissance Cloth Hall and other historic landmarks are included in our morning city sightseeing tour. The afternoon is free for independent activities. (B)

#### **DAY 16, SATURDAY**

KRAKOW - PRAGUE

After a drive through the Polish countryside, we cross into the Czech Republic. Then it's on to Prague, with its Baroque churches, promenades, parks and ancient city walls. (B,D)

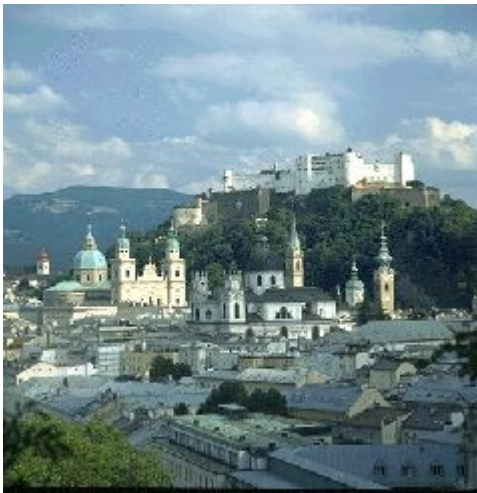

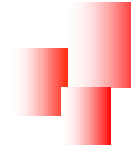
